To be the indispensable resource for individuals with cerebral palsy and other disabilities, their families, and their communities.



\$250,000 IMPROVE UNITED CEREBRAL PALSY CRM & INFRASTRUCTURE

To accurately demonstrate and leverage the impact of UCP and the affiliate network in the disability space, a digital network containing affiliate's critical data like programs/services, number of people served, number of staff members and other information must be developed and easily accessible by UCP stakeholders.

Enhancing UCP's Salesforce solution will enable our stakeholders to make informed business decisions related to, but not limited to, securing funding for programs and services, raising awareness of the UCP brand and network, and efficiently advocating for the people we serve and represent on the federal and state level.

^{\$}200,000 BUILD BRAND AWARENESS & RECOGNITION

Increase the profile and visibility of UCP and the affiliate network to promote the diversity of services and supports offered to the disability community. \$80,000 FUND RESEARCH GRANT PROGRAM

This program awards grants to organizations conducting translational cerebral palsy research. It can develop real-life transformative treatments that bridge the gap between research and care for children with disabilities.

\$80,000 SPONSOR EARLY DETECTION & INTERVENTION (EDI) COLLABORATIVE

UCP supports more than 25 clinicians training in early detection and cerebral palsy-specific therapies. This critical funding makes it possible for future research leaders to attend health summits, monthly virtual instruction and leadership training.
